After nearly eleven years as the Laconia City Manager, Scott Myers will be leaving his position with the City to pursue other opportunities. Municipal Resources Inc. (MRI), a New Hampshire company with a great deal of experience in conducting searches of this nature, will begin work soon to help us find our new City Manager.

As part of the search process MRI will be holding two Listening Sessions for the public to attend and provide input on what they would like to see in the next City Manager, along with what they see as short and long-term challenges for Laconia.

The two Listening Sessions will be held in the Laconia Rotary Hall Auditorium in the Laconia Public Library on Thursday, April 7, 2022. The first session will be at 2:00 pm and the second will be at 7:00 pm.

On Saturday, March 26th the Laconia Gilford Lions Club is joining with the Green Sanctuary Committee of the Unitarian Universalist Society of Laconia to collect clean SOFT plastics.

We ARE collecting plastic grocery bags, vegetable bags, bubble wrap, newspaper sleeves, bread bags, air packing bags, dry cleaning bags, wood pellet bags, ice bags, cereal box liners, and plastic films labeled with a #2 or #4 recycling symbol.

****We no longer accept pet food bags.****

Each and every piece of CLEAN plastic is sent to Maine via the way-stop at Hannaford's in Gilford to be repurposed and made into composite decking and outdoor furniture. Our community is doing a great job in keeping these plastics from polluting the Earth. The February collection netted 237 pounds. Each time we hold the event the amount increases. THEN . . .

Houses at 120 and 130 Pleasant St., Laconia, were demolished, 50 years ago this week for 'future expansion' of J.J. Morin Inc., whose offices and warehouse were off-photo at left, on New Salem Street. House at right had been the Lewis F. Busiel property, last occupied by his daughter, Mrs. Ellen Plummer. (Lewis was a brother of John Weymouth Busiel and built a four-story wooden hosiery mill on Mill Street, opposite his brother's brick mill.) In both photos, Pleasant Street runs left to right at front. The Christian Science Church is glimpsed at far right. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)

The 'future expansion' envisioned by J.J. Morin never occurred, the Pleasant Street property having remained a vacant lot for the past half-century. NH residents are feeling the pinch of higher energy costs. The crisis in Ukraine, among other factors, has impacted energy costs across the globe. Historically, energy costs have been affected whenever there has been a major geopolitical event in the past 50 years. 

Think Twice Before Buying Easter Chicks

With Easter coming soon, you'll be seeing ads for Easter chicks. Aww...aren't they cute? However, the City considers chickens, even the cute little chicks, to be livestock and NOT pets. In most areas of the City, livestock including chickens are not allowed to be kept on the property.

Chickens, ducks, guinea hens, pigs, goats, and other agricultural animals are not permitted in most districts in the urban/suburban districts in Laconia. Agriculture and agricultural animals are permitted in the RR1 (Residential Rural), RR2 (Residential Rural Corridor) and AI (Airport Industrial) districts. In the CR (Commercial Resort) district, agriculture and the animals typically associated with agriculture are only allowed by Special Exception granted by the Zoning Board of Adjustment. If you're not sure what zoning district you live in, check your tax card on the City [website](http://www.coloniallaconia.com) or call the Planning office at (603) 524-1264 to find out.

A good idea is to keep your chick purchases to the pink marshmallow kind!
