





Soft Plastic Recycling

Soft clean plastics are accepted. Blue and white Amazon bags are accepted, as well as pellet bags and brand new from factory mattress plastic coverings. No crunchy snack bags. No pet food bags. No boat storage covers. Any attached paper on bags needs to be cut off.



THEN ...

Keller's Confectionery on Main Street, Laconia, is seen in the 1960s, before Urban Renewal. Between Keller's and the former Crystal Cafe building (at right) was California Court, which led to a number of buildings behind the Main Street structures. A new Keller's Ice Cream and Sandwich Shop was just opening, 50 years ago, on Lake Street. See 50 years ago this week in 'Our yesterdays.' (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Crystal Cafe Building was razed in late April 1969 and the Keller-Bean Block was demolished in early December 1970. The space remained vacant and was used for ground-level parking for another couple years until the Municipal Parking Garage was constructed, in 1973-1974, opening June 21, 1974. The Keller Confectionery was located at left, approximately opposite the crosswalk, with the Crystal Cafe next to the right, then Pitman Hardware and, finally, the 'Lower Bank.'
