UNH NH BUILD A BETTER MOSETRAP COMPETITION

ROAD TAPE MACHINE
CITY OF LACONIA

OVERVIEW OF THE INNOVATION:
During Bike Week in Laconia, the public works team lays down traffic tape on Lakeside Avenue, to make parking in the middle of the road for motorcycles and changing the traffic pattern for motorcycle's only.

The team worked together and used an old broken line striping machine stripped down to its frame, old kart wheel, bolts and nuts, and fabricated pieces of steel that were left over from other projects. The road tape machine hooks onto their Graco LineDriver HD ride on attachment.

Previously they laid down the tape by hand, now with their innovation a four hour job takes one hour. Their innovation helped them keep all of the lines that were laid down straight.

BENEFITS:
There are time and labor cost savings. Their road tape machine was created using materials they already had, including a broken line striping machine. They developed this idea as a team with the mechanics, supervisors, and with the line striping paint crew. The Laconia team constructed a plan of action, worked together and came up with a solution for getting their road marking tape machine completed. The machine produced nice straight lines with the tape, keeping road users safe during bike week.





**TEMPORARY
ROAD
CLOSURE**



The manholes and many catch basins on North Main between the railroad tracks and Oak Street are in the wheel ruts. The impacts from the truck and other traffic have damaged the mortar in the bricks and they have settled enough to create a bad situation that will just get worse. Part of the problem is the impact of traffic on the structures before the mortar cures. For this reason, we will be trying something different this time when we work on these structures.

The week of May 27, we will be closing the section of North Main Street between the railroad tracks and Oak Street for 24 hours. During the first day of work, a contractor will raise all the structures and use a mortar with an accelerator in it to cure the mortar overnight. During the following day, the contractor will pave around the structures and the road will be reopened.

Residents who live on the road will be able to access their property by using Lyford, Parker and Harvard Streets. This will enable us to shut down North Main to thru traffic during the curing period. Emergency vehicles will still have access if required.

The exact dates have not been finalized as the contractor is ensuring they have enough crew to meet that timeline. The two time periods targeted at this time are Wednesday/Thursday (May 29 and 30) or Thursday/Friday (May 30 and 31).

THEN ...

The Old Tucker House on Mill Street, with Beacon Street glimpsed at left, is seen around 1890, just before it was torn down. Originally the home of Daniel Avery, who had come here around 1790, it was one of the oldest houses in the city. Daniel Tucker was one of the owners of the Avery Mill, which began operating as early as 1813 on the site now occupied by the Belknap Mill, built in 1823. Tucker also owned a blacksmith shop next to the river. The large business block at left had been built by merchant, and later mayor, Samuel B. Smith in the late 1800s. (Laconia Public Library)



... AND NOW

The Tucker House site became part of a series of parking lots, the most recent created during the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s-early 1970s, as part of the new City Hall and Busiel Mill Parking Lot. The Smith wooden block was home to the Laconia Furniture Co., 1914-1926, and became the newsroom and editorial offices of The Laconia Evening Citizen in the 1950s. 




