




Methodist Church Plans Rummage Sale and Flea Market



Curbside Collection Reminders!

Please do not put your solid waste containers at the curb based on the time the solid waste collection truck usually services your street. The contractor can adjust the route and its timing for various reasons, including:

- Construction projects
- Holidays
- City wide events such as Motorcycle Week
- Availability of an extra crew

Besides delaying collection a day, certain holidays will delay trash pickup by a day, impacting the time of collection on Saturday. The contractor puts multiple crews on the road on the Saturday after a holiday to finish the routes early, and to let their crews have more time off over the weekend.

This year July 4th is on a Friday. The contractor will put at least two crews on the road to collect trash, and they will also help the recycling crew with their collection.

Also, on other occasions during a week when the contractor has more crews available, they may put a second crew out on their curbside collection route.

Per our [City Code](#) the contractor can start collecting curbside solid waste at 6 am. When a second crew is on a route, that crew will start on a street that is usually serviced more towards the middle of the normal route.

The contractor starts curbside collection at 6 am to ensure they are off the City's major roads such as Union Ave., Court St., Main St. and Elm St. before the beginning of the rush hour traffic.

Soft plastics and Styrofoam must be clean and free of labels. Plastics cannot be any snack bags, candy wrappers, any product wrapping that is "crunchy" sounding. Mailers are acceptable. No bird seed or pet food bags can be collected. We are pleased and proud that your community saved from the landfills some 1,100 pounds of soft plastics at our last collection. All that is saved for collection is converted into composite decking and furniture.

THEN ...

The 'Old Red House', at 208 Pleasant St., Laconia, was a typical farmhouse of the early 1800s — on a street that had been part of the Province Road from Durham to the Upper Connecticut River Valley, and passing through the early settlement called 'Meredith Bridge,' as Laconia was once known. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The new home of Joseph W. Pitman (1858-1921), built sometime prior to 1893, replaced the Old Red House. Pitman was general manager and treasurer of Pitman Manufacturing Co and had been associated with his brother, Walter H. Pitman, in the retail hardware business for many years. He was also identified with the hosiery industry and, since the death of his oldest brother, Charles F. Pitman, had been at the head of the Pitman Manufacturing Co. The barn behind the house at 220 Pleasant St. is still there. Further up the street, the house at 226 Pleasant St. was a very early structure on the Province Road, occupied by Timothy Dexter Somes (1774-1834) who had come to Laconia in 1813.
