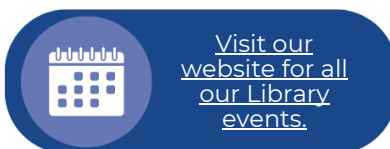

### **Belknap Mill Museum Presents: *Color in Motion – The Art of Marcia Santore*** ***Exhibition Opening Friday, September 5, 5pm-7pm***

The Belknap Mill Museum is delighted to present "**Color in Motion – The Art of Marcia Santore**," a new solo exhibition celebrating the vivid, expressive, and thought-provoking work of contemporary painter Marcia Santore. The exhibition will be on view from September 3 through September 27 in the museum's Riverside Art Gallery.

Santore's paintings use bold color, layered texture, and image-based abstraction to evoke a sense of motion, mystery, and emotional depth. Her work often hints at the familiar—an imagined landscape, a

mythical figure, or the essence of an animal—while embracing the abstract and symbolic. Each piece invites viewers to explore and interpret, to feel and reflect. "I make paintings. I love color and movement," says Santore. "Art is an act of communication between artist and viewer. No artwork is really complete without viewers bringing their own experience to their perception of a piece."

Originally from Texas and now based in Plymouth, New Hampshire, Santore's work has been exhibited in solo, group, and juried shows across the U.S., and is part of public and private collections both nationally and internationally. She brings to her practice a wealth of experience not only as a painter but also as a curator, writer, and arts advocate.

Join us for an Opening Reception on Friday, September 5 from 5–7 PM, where guests can meet the artist, explore the exhibit, and enjoy refreshments in the beautifully restored historic setting of the Belknap Mill.

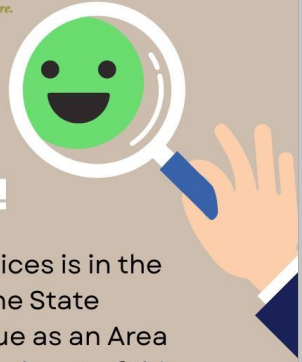

**Are you a United States Military Veteran?**  
**If so, you are eligible to receive Veterans' Bucks.**

Each week from mid-Aug. to Sept., receive 'bucks' valued at \$20 to spend at the farmers' markets listed above. **NOTE: Markets run to early October, Veterans' Bucks may not.**

**Must be a US Military Veteran, or active duty, and able to provide documentation.**

Valid forms of identification include: DD214, VA Healthcare card, NH Drivers License with a Veteran designation, or a Retired Military card.

Bucks must be used only at market location printed on the ticket-type 'bucks'.

Use of bucks is only valid for the purchase of food (vegetables/fruit, meat, dairy, bakery items).

**How to obtain Veterans' Bucks.** Visit the Veterans' Bucks booth at the market of choice and show valid identification. Bucks are available until grant funding is expended.

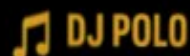

# Our Yesterdays

## THEN ...

The Moulton Opera House and O'Shea Department Store are seen, all decked out for some patriotic occasion in the late 1890s or early 1900s. The next building at left of the Opera House Block was the Furniture Department — later occupied by Laconia Hardware Co. until the late 1960s. Watereing trough for horses is seen in middle of the square. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



## ... AND NOW

The O'Shea and Laconia Hardware buildings were demolished during the city's Urban Renewal program of the late 1960s and early 1970s. The structure at far left, replaced in 1940 after a fire, by Melnick's Shoe Store and Clear Weave, was also razed during Urban Renewal. Today's Bootlegger's, Rent-A-Center and MC Cycle occupy part of the square, out in front of the earlier buildings — site of which is now a parking lot facing Beacon Street West. Prior to the city's Urban Renewal Program, Water Street connectd with the square between O'Shea's and the McIntyre Block, on Pleasant Street, at right. (Gabriel Perry/The Laconia Daily Sun)
