This sale will offer a variety of member-dug hardy perennials, such as hosta, sedum, iris, daylilies, succulents and daisies. Herbs, house plants and dish gardens will also be available for purchase. All plants will be labeled with growing requirements, sun/shade, dry/moist conditions. Several of the Club's Master Gardeners will be available to answer questions, and help you select the right plants for your garden, as you browse the assortment of plant material. Come early for the best selections.

There will also be a Craft Table with garden and garden-related items such as garden gloves, decorated pots and birdhouses, and garden tools for sale. A raffle opportunity will offer three specialty items.

Please come and visit Whitt today! We promise you will fall in love with this handsome character.



The White Mountain National Forest and the Weeks Act

Taylor resident Vincent Lunetta will tell the story of the Weeks Act – so visible in New Hampshire's beautiful White Mountains - Monday, June 5 at 6:30 p.m. in Taylor's Woodside Building. The event is free and open to the public. Historical and contemporary photos as well as video clips from the White Mountain National Forest (WMNF) will be shown.

The Weeks Act of 1911 was named for John Wingate Weeks, born in Lancaster. Initially, the Act had been contentious federal legislation that ultimately enabled the protection and wise management of what is now the nearly 800,000 acres of the WMNF. The legislation of this act enabled the creation of 41 eastern National Forests that now protect and manage more than 20 million acres in 24 states.
