

New Hampshire Dam Bureau Lecture March 8th

The Department of Environmental Services Dam Bureau regulates the repair, reconstruction, maintenance and operation of existing dams. It also reviews design plans and issues decisions for the construction, operation and maintenance of new dams.



The Dam Bureau is also responsible for regulating the retention and/or release of stored water to support a variety of uses for both public and private purposes.

Important Message from the Laconia Fire Dept.



On Tuesday, February 21, 2017 at 10:05 am the fire alarm sounded at Genesis. Laconia and Weirs firefighters responded to the Genesis facility at 175 Blueberry Lane. On the scene, a staff worker advised the Lieutenant that there was a fire in a chair. The fire crews went in to investigate and found a chair in a patient's room with a burn hole in the chair back. The cause of the fire? The sun's rays!

There was a make-up style mirror on the windowsill. The sun was shining brightly and coming through the window and hitting the mirror. The rays from the mirror were directly on the chair back and started the fire. Someone saw the fire and pulled the fire alarm. There was minimal disruption at the facility and everyone did a great job keeping the incident under control. This will go down as one of the most unusual causes of a fire in recent memory!

Youth Mental Health First Aid

An 8-hour certification course for caring adults who want to help youth (ages 12-18) who may be in crisis or experiencing a mental health challenge.



The course is designed for adults who regularly interact with adolescents (teachers, school staff, coaches, youth group leaders, parents, bus drivers, etc.). In January 2013, President Obama recommended Youth Mental Health Training for all. The core Mental Health First Aid course has been successfully offered to more than 100,000 people across the USA, including hospital staff, employers and business leaders, faith communities, law enforcement, and the general public. **Below are the two trainings that are available.**

WHAT WILL PARTICIPANTS LEARN?

The course teaches participants the risk factors and warning signs of a variety of mental health challenges common among adolescents, including anxiety, depression, psychosis, eating disorders, AD/HD, disruptive behavior disorders, and substance use disorder. Participants do not learn to diagnose, nor how to provide any therapy or counseling – rather, participants learn to support a youth developing signs and symptoms of a mental illness or in an emotional crisis by applying a core five-step action plan:

- ~Assess for risk of suicide or harm
- ~Listen nonjudgmentally
- ~Give reassurance and information
- ~Encourage appropriate professional help
- ~Encourage self-help and other support strategies

The Youth Mental Health First Aid USA curriculum is primarily focused on information participants can use to help adolescents and transition-age youth, ages 12-18.


