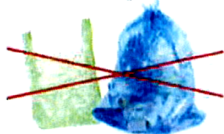

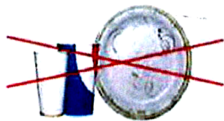

NOT ACCEPTED



NO Plastic Bags or Bagged Recycling

(Take clean plastic bags to your local retailer for recycling)



NO Coated Paper Items

(Items with a plastic lining such as waxed coffee or soda cups, & waxed paper plates)



NO Disposable Items

(Styrofoam™, napkins, paper towels, tissues, plastic utensils, dirty recycling, register tape, condiment packets, straws, stirrers & coffee pods)



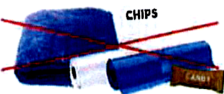
NO Toys, Hangers, Clothes, or Shoes

(Gently used items can be donated)



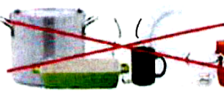
NO Waste or Wood

(Rope, twine, diapers, food, pet & yard waste)



NO Plastic Wrap, Films or Tarps

(Food bags or wrappers, plastic or shrink wrap & tarps)



NO Ceramics, Pots, Pans, or Baking Glass

(Gently used items can be donated)



NO Hazardous Materials

(Find safe and secure disposal near you)



NO Medical Waste

(Find safe and secure disposal near you)



NO Rubber or Scrap Metal

(Find for alternative recycling)



NO Electronics, Batteries or Bulbs

(Find alternative recycling)

? FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Zero-Sort® recycling?

Zero-Sort recycling is Casella's state-of-the-art process which enables paper, cardboard, plastic, glass, and metal cans to be collected together in one bin eliminating the need for you to separate recyclables.

Can I throw trash and recyclables into my recycling bin?

NO. Your recycling bin is for Zero-Sort recyclables only. Items that cannot be recycled should be tossed into your trash bin.

How should I prepare recyclables?

Recyclables must be empty and rinsed clean of food residue. Corrugated cardboard boxes should be broken down into 2' max pieces. **DO NOT** tie newspaper, cardboard or jugs with twine. Handles should be removed from pails and paper bags.

What type of metal can I recycle in my bin?

Aluminum and tin cans are acceptable. **NOT ACCEPTED** items include pots, pans, aerosol cans, and scrap metal such as automotive parts, motors, and appliances or any other metal items.

Can I put grocery bags into my Zero-Sort bin or place recyclables in plastic bags?

NO. Plastic bags of any kind are not accepted in Zero-Sort recycling. To recycle grocery bags, please bring them to a participating grocery or retail store.

How should I recycle large items that won't fit inside my bin?

Please call 800-CASELLA to schedule a pickup if you have large materials that do not fit inside your bin.

Can I recycle pizza boxes?

You can recycle pizza boxes with light grease stains. Boxes with stuck-on food or dripping grease cannot be recycled but they are compostable.

Why aren't paper cups recyclable?

Paper cups have a thin, plastic lining or waxed finish that cannot be recycled.

2. Memorial Park Softball Field off Pearl St. (on Memorial Park Drive). Place trees in the specifically marked/designated area ONLY.

STAY OFF ALL PONDS AND LAKES!

The Laconia Fire Department is very concerned about your safety, especially young children who are playing outdoors. We are extremely concerned about the fact that many small ponds and lakes have a very thin layer of ice covering them. This ice is now covered with snow, which acts as insulation. This is a very dangerous condition. The snow will actually insulate the water and slow down the freezing process. The water temperature of Lake Winnepesaukee, as of Monday, December 18th is still in the high 30s. It will take several more weeks of cold temperatures to lower the temperature of the bigger lakes to point that they start freezing consistently.

It takes until January, at a minimum, for the bigger lakes to freeze to a point where the ice is safe. We issue these safety tips so that you can enjoy the use of the lakes with a reasonable degree of safety.

We suggest the following safety tips when going out on the ice:

- Never ice skate, or ice fish alone
- Always tell someone where you will be skating or fishing and when you will be home.
- Ponds need at least 7 days of below freezing temperature to be considered even remotely safe.
- Have a rope or rescue ladder readily available
- Never skate near open water
- Never attempt to rescue an animal that may be in trouble on the ice
- Have a means of calling for help
- Wear a flotation device and a helmet (similar to a bike helmet)



For snowmobilers we issue this advice – stay off the bigger lakes and ponds. Do not skim – it is against the law and can be a deadly act.

For anyone who may break through the ice, try not to panic. Turn towards the direction you came from – this ice was safe. Get to the edge and attempt to pull yourself out of the water. Kick hard to push yourself onto the ice. Try to spread your weight out as much as possible. Slide up onto the ice and then roll or crawl away from the opening. Do not stand near the unsafe ice as your weight in one spot will probably cause you to break through again.

If you cannot get out hold on to the ice shelf and scream for help. Draw your arms and legs in close to your body as this will help hold in your body heat. Attempting to swim will actually cause you to lose body heat even faster. Try to save your energy.

If you see someone or suspect that someone is in trouble call 911. If you call for help be specific as to where you are on the pond or lake - many ponds are very big and difficult to access. If there is an animal in trouble on the ice call us and we will attempt to rescue the animal. Do not attempt to rescue an animal yourself. We have the proper equipment to do the job safely. Remember anytime you suspect that you need our help do not hesitate to call 911. It is extremely important that we be notified as soon as possible of any emergency so that we can effectively deal with it. Time is probably the most critical element in emergency response.

METER MAINTENANCE PROGRAM



Meters are changed periodically to comply with the Public Utilities Commission's Rules and Regulations, the American Water Works Association and in accordance with the Laconia Water Works' Tariff. The Water Department has an annual program that replaces meters and **there is no cost to the property owner**. Our goal is to change out 600 meters over the next two months.

The Water Department will contact those property owners whose water meters are to be changed. We are in the process of sending letters and making phone calls to schedule appointments. This process takes approximately 15-20 minutes.
