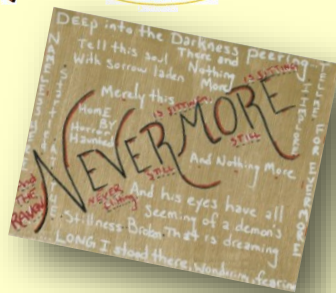

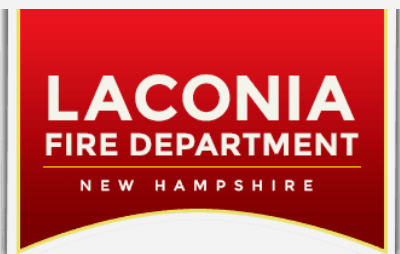

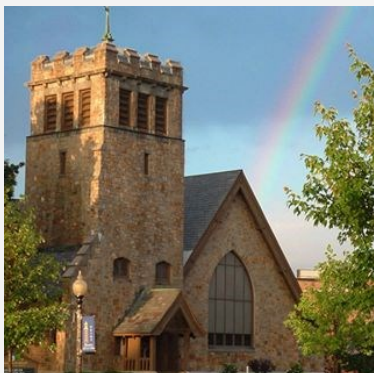
On April 11th, we will have a tour of the new Laconia Fire Station and see many historic artifacts and photographs. There will also be a short talk about the Laconia Fire Department.

workcampNE is a non profit 501(c)(3) organization running week long camps enabling up to 500 students and adult volunteers to work on approximately 60 homes of the elderly, handicapped or severely under-resourced each year.

All work is done **free of charge** to the community and to the residents. Residents are chosen primarily on references from local social service agencies. Although faith-based, **workcampNE** never discriminates against a resident for religious beliefs, social situations, age, etc. As long as there is a viable need and a safe, healthy working situation for student volunteers, **workcampNE** will consider working at the home. Residents **must be** the homeowner.

All materials, tools and food are supplied to each camper. Residents **are not** responsible for lunches, drinks, or anything else during our time with them. Bathrooms at the homes we work at will be used unless not possible, in which case a nearby facility will be found.

workcampNE is financed entirely from the volunteers' tuition as well as individual or corporation contributions. Jobs include roofing, scraping/painting, deck repair, handicapped ramps, replacement windows and doors. Any work that is not structural, electrical or plumbing will be considered. All work is done by volunteers, paying tuition to attend. The ages range from jr. high schoolers to high schoolers (including college-aged). All work done is carefully supervised by volunteer contractors and experienced handymen. All campers are required to carry medical insurance and **workcampNE** carries an adequate general liability policy.

Work weeks run from Sunday to Saturday. Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. is spent at the job sites. Evenings are for dinner, nightly programming and free time before lights out. Friday is a half day to allow visiting campers a bit of relaxation. Crews consist of 1 or more adults (over the age of 21) and five students. All adult leaders over 21 have background safety checks done.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

COURT ST

The Laconia Department of Public Works, in conjunction with Busby Construction, will soon be reconstructing Court Street, including sidewalks, sewer lines, and drainage, from Keasor Court to Fair Street beginning April 9th (weather permitting).

As part of this project, Eversource will be relocating utility poles along all of Court Street, the Water Department will be upgrading portions of their lines, Liberty Utilities will be relaying portions of the gas lines and Consolidated Communications will be relocating their telephone lines.

Local businesses and residents will be able to access their property during the construction process. Some delays may occur as the work progresses and work sites move along the road.

On your scheduled trash day, please place your trash and recyclables at the curb no later than 6:00 am so that they can be picked up before construction begins. The collection trucks may arrive promptly at 6:00 am, not at the time you have been accustomed to.

The City appreciates your cooperation and understanding during the construction process.

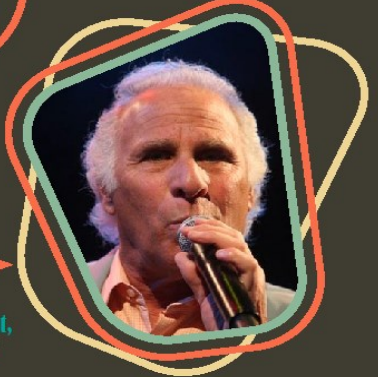

The Brush Dump is located at 325 Hilliard Road (366-4855). The facility is now open on Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 8 am to 3 pm.

Materials accepted are as follows:

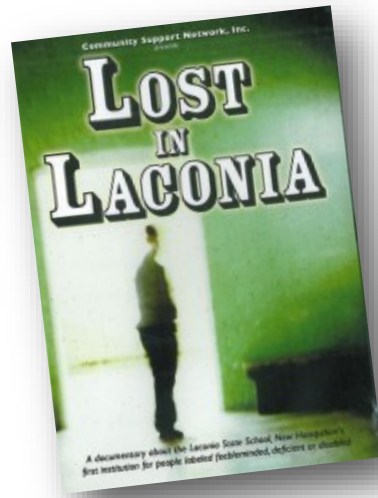
- Clean wood (not painted, stained or pressure treated)
- Branches of trees (no larger than 3" in diameter/3' in length)

Leaves are not accepted at the brush dump.

Residents who want to use this facility must have a Laconia dump sticker or day pass. Dump stickers and day passes are available at the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, 45 Beacon St. East in Laconia.
