Please Consider Helping Clear Snow from Nearby Fire Hydrants

With winter upon us and the snow starting already, you will once again begin to see firefighters out shoveling the snow away from fire hydrants so they can be accessed without delay in the case of a fire.

In Laconia, depending on how busy the department is responding to emergency incidents, this can take up to three days after a storm to complete. This is where you can help!

If there is a fire hydrant near your home or work and you are out clearing snow, please consider clearing the snow from around your nearby fire hydrant as well. Three feet in all directions and a clear path to the street is what we look for to provide best access.

Many people already do this, and we very much appreciate your help. We understand that not everyone can safely do this, and that's understandable. This is why we will continue to be out working to complete the job in a timely manner.

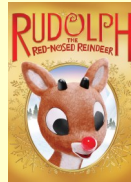

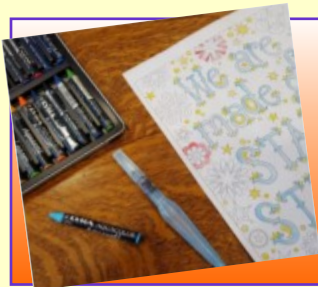
