



As the Education Center Coordinator for UNH Cooperative Extension, Emma Erler shares her horticultural expertise and passion with home gardeners throughout the state. 

THEN . . .

Rudy's Super Market and a First National grocery store, next door, are seen in Lakeport Square, along with a Weeks Dairy delivery truck, in the 1950s. The First National store had earlier been located in the Opera House Block, at left, in the Rudy's space. Following a fire, Jan. 26, 1939, which destroyed the two-story Osgood Block, the grocery chain announced plans to build the one-story modern structure at right, faced with buff bricks, by May 1 of that year. It is unclear just when the First National Building actually opened, but city records indicate 1942. The store is, however, listed in city directories beginning in 1940. The building glimpsed at far right was the Cushing Block, home to the Muzsey and Hopkins — later Hopkins and Barlow — hardware store. (Lakeport Community Association 2014 Calendar)



. . . AND NOW

Recycled Percussion's Chaos & Kindness store opened, Sept. 21, in the old First National Building. Other than the grocery chain, that structure was most notably home to Henry Rogers' Five Cents to a Dollar Store from the mid-1950s until his death in 1992. In the Opera House Block, Kasper's Shoe Store was another longtime occupant in the 1960s and 1970s. Currently, The Laconia Daily Sun is preparing to move to the first floor of the Opera House Block in the near future. The Lake Village Apartments, at right, opened in 1981, replacing the Cushing Block and Mount Belknap Hotel. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)



Buildings of the Belknap County Farm in the 19th and early 20th century occupied the same land off North Main Street as today's modern County Complex.

Exhibit on “County Farm and Alms House”

Be sure to visit a new exhibit, “The Belknap County Farm and Alms House”, on the Upper Level of the Laconia Public Library, co-sponsored by the Laconia Historical and Museum Society and the Library.

Belknap County was set off from Strafford County in 1841, with the County Court House on Court Street, then in Gilford but which was annexed to the town of Laconia in 1874. The County Farm (now the County Complex, which also includes the County Jail, Sheriff's Department and County Commissioners' offices) was located at approximately its current location, off North Main St.

The exhibit highlights the 19th and 20th century evolution of the County Farm and Alms House., which LHMS Executive Director Pat Tierney calls “a great story of regional compassion and local diligence.” From its earliest beginnings, he says, County citizens and civic organizations “joined to create this New Hampshire institution which became a model for addressing not only agricultural excellence, but the humane and housing needs of many.” Before today's modern Belknap County facility, the farm “housed extensive livestock, produced an array of vegetables, protected the disadvantaged against the elements, and built a reputation of pride in labor among short and long term residents. The adjacent cemetery will also be a focus of this history not to be forgotten.”

The exhibit opening is free and open to the public. The exhibit can be seen during regular Library hours into December. Tierney notes that student tours can be arranged and further information is available by calling 527-1278. Visit LHMS on Facebook or at www.laconiahistory.org.
