PROPERTY TAX BILLS MAILED MAY 29

Property tax bills will be mailed on May 29th. They are due on July 1st.

Payments are accepted [on-line](#), by mail or at the counter in City Hall during our normal business hours which are Monday through Friday, 8:30 am - 4:30 pm. When visiting City Hall, please be sure to comply with our posted social distancing guidelines and wear a facemask. If you do not have a facemask, we will provide one to you.

For your convenience there is also a drop slot located on the side door of City Hall.

We can accept credit cards for payments at the counter and online.... Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover are accepted.

Convenience fees apply to all credit card and on-line transactions.

Public Works Department

The City's solid waste Ordinance limits businesses to leave no more than seven trash cans out for collection. The trash cans must have a lid and the cans cannot be overflowing.

Beginning on June 5th, the City's curbside collection contractor will no longer empty trash cans over the seven allowed under the Ordinance from any business that has placed more than seven trash cans in the right of way for collection. Businesses who generate more than seven cans of trash per week should either contract with a private collection service or bring their trash to the City's Transfer Station and dispose of the trash for a fee.

The trash collection contractor will also not collect any trash can with trash bags stacked such that the lid to the trash can cannot be placed on the can.

Please see the City's Ordinance below:

§ 194-5 Maximum quantity of collectible waste.

A. Residential. The number of containers or bundles put out for collection from any single-family or duplex dwelling is limited to two per family.

B. Commercial/multifamily dwellings. The number of containers and bundles placed for collection from any other premises shall not exceed seven for each collection.

§ 194-2 Refuse containers

A. For household garbage and rubbish. Every householder shall provide and maintain in proper order for the purpose of sorting and putting out for collection of garbage a sufficient number of tightly sealed containers having a capacity of not more than 30 gallons each.

Although City Hall has now reopened to the public, we are strongly encouraging our residents to continue to use our on-line services and contact our various departments by phone to the fullest extent possible.

Contact information is listed on the last page of this newsletter.

City Hall is open Monday - Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. At this time there are no extended hours on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of the month, although we hope to resume those extended hours in the future.

There are some new procedures in place in our building. One door of City Hall will be unlocked and available only for people coming into the building, and another will be used to exit the building. There will be a staff member stationed in the lobby to help people get to the right department, and to be sure visitors have the documents they need to make the best use of their time while they are in City Hall.

Please be sure to wear a facemask upon entering the building and, if you do not have one, we will provide one to you. Social distancing practices are now in effect and required.

You are encouraged to schedule appointments with specific departments (other than the City Clerk's Office) to ensure there is a staff person available to assist you and to control the number of people in one area at the same time.

We are working hard to ensure the safety of our customers and employees to make it possible for us to continue providing services to our community and its residents. We appreciate your consideration.

Information for our residents regarding City services

To keep our residents informed regarding City services and operations during this public health situation, please see the information below:

- City Hall is now open to the public during our regular hours, Monday-Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. However, residents are strongly encouraged to utilize our on-line services whenever possible. Please see the previous page for detailed information regarding City Hall.
- The Community Center and all City park houses continue to be closed to all programs at this time. All of the City's playgrounds, basketball courts and ball fields are closed until further notice. City parks and beaches remain open to the public at this time for recreation like walking, running and biking. Please be sure to abide by the Governor's order with regard to social distancing and gathering in groups of no more than 10 people. **The City's tennis courts at Leavitt park and Memorial Park are now open.** Call the Community Center at 524-5046 for more information.
- Although Library buildings remain closed to the public until further notice, they are operating a "take-out" service and offering lots of on-line activities. Please visit the Library's [website](#) or call 524-4775. Information about the Library's programs is also included on page two of this newsletter.
- The Water Department remains closed to the general public. Please visit their website [here](#) for information on how to pay your bill, or call 524-0901.
- The Public Works office is now open and will allow one person in the lobby at a time. We encourage customers to use our on-line services whenever possible. Services that can be completed on-line include plumbing, driveway, sidewalk and excavation permits. Daily dump passes can be purchased directly at the Transfer Station; please be sure to bring identification that shows you are a Laconia resident. Annual dump stickers may be obtained from the City Clerk or Tax Office in City Hall. They are good for the calendar year for the Transfer Station and the Brush Dump. Please call the Department of Public Works at 528-6379 for additional information. Spring Clean-Up Days have been postponed and will be rescheduled in the near future.

PARKING ENFORCEMENT IN WEIRS BEACH

Now in effect! Vehicles parking in the public parking spaces on Lakeside Avenue and in the Endicott Rock Parking Lot must pay to use the parking spaces. Parking in this area is “pay by space”. Please ensure that you know your parking space number when you leave your car as the parking kiosks will ask for that information.



Please note that the parking kiosks can only accept coins or credit/debit cards. Visitors must pay to park between the hours of 9:00 am and 10:00 pm at either location. There are five, three and two-hour parking spaces available on Lakeside Avenue. Parking at these spaces costs \$1/hour. Endicott Rock Park parking lot has no time limit; it costs \$2/hour to park there.

If you have a Laconia Resident Beach Sticker on your vehicle, you do not have to pay to park at the Endicott Rock Park parking lot, but you will have to pay for parking at the kiosks on Lakeside Avenue. Resident Beach Stickers are available for purchase by Laconia residents for both Bond Beach and Endicott Rock Park beach parking lot - see information on page 14 for details.

Property Tax Credit Forms

DP-8 forms are now available on-line at <https://www.revenue.nh.gov/forms/low-moderate.htm> or by calling the Assessing office at 527-1268. The deadline for filing the form is June 30.

This form applies to the Low/Moderate income homeowner's property tax credit.

This program is offered by the State and refunds the State education tax portion of the tax rate to qualifying owners.



GOT LUNCH! Laconia, 2020 Registrations NOW Open

GOT LUNCH! Laconia is a summer healthy lunch program that delivers healthy groceries directly to the child's home every Monday morning. Deliveries will begin June 22. **June 15 is the deadline** to receive the first delivery on June 22. You may continue to register at any time throughout the summer, but new registrations close one week before each delivery date to enable delivery routes to be developed each week.

All Laconia school age children are eligible. Although our target population is those families who qualify for free and reduced' lunches at the school, it is NOT a requirement for participation. If you need help feeding your children/child this summer, this program is designed for you. GOT LUNCH! Laconia does not want any child to go hungry this summer.

Each year we require a **new registration** form for you to participate, even if you participated last year. We encourage you to register on-line at www.gotlunchlaconia.org There is an easy on-line registration form on the website. Paper copies of the registration form will be in the current Friday, GOT LUNCH! Laconia bags being distributed by the school buses **OR** you may pick up a copy at the Laconia Library distribution table.




Our yesterdays

THEN . . .

H.H. Buffum had sold the Winnipesaukee Pier at The Weirs to James T. Irwin 'of Music Hall,' The Laconia Democrat reported, 100 years ago this week, in 1920. Sale included 'about 30 motor boats, row boats, canoes, etc., and Mr. Irwin will conduct the Pier in connection with his summer dances and moving picture business. The Pier was originally the old Boston and Maine steamboat wharf, and was purchased by the late Dr. (J. Alonzo) Greene, and later by Mr. Buffum, who enlarged the wharf and constructed the Pier and has conducted a very successful business there since 1908.' In 1920, the Music Hall was located off-photo at left, on Tower Street, next to the Trinity Methodist Church. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



. . . AND NOW

In November 1924, the Music Hall on Tower Street was destroyed in a fire which wiped out 13 buildings, including the church and the New Hotel Weirs. Undaunted, Irwin found financing and a construction company which built his 'Winnipesaukee Gardens' dance hall — in time for a June 26, 1925 opening — above the pier, traces of which can still be found below the former ballroom, with its many additions and renovations. Vehicle Registration

Tips

Although City Hall is now open to the public, there are still many types of City business that can be accomplished on-line, and we strongly encourage you to take advantage of those services.

Two of the most common questions people ask relate to completing vehicle registrations and dog licensing on-line. Please see below for instructions on how to accomplish both:

If you are looking to renew your vehicle registration on-line, click [here](#). This will bring you to the Vehicle Registration page of our website where you can follow instructions to get the process going to renew your registration. If you do not have the capability to process on-line transactions, please call our office at 527-1265 to receive the amount due for your registration and either mail your payment or place your payment in our mail slot located next to the door on the right (Belknap Mill) side of our building.



To renew your dog license on-line, click the image (left). Enter your dog tag number as it is printed on your dog's license (including the dash followed by the last two digits of the year).

Click on "Sample License" on our dog license page to locate where on your dog's printed license you can find the license number.

Please note that a late fee \$1/month for your dog registration will be in effect as of June 1st.

The deadline for party affiliation changes is June 2, 2020.



This free, hands-on Zoom class will introduce participants to Genealogy and teach them how to build their family tree on Ancestry.com. (A paid Ancestry membership is NOT necessary for this class)



COVID-19 AVOIDING SCAMS

Scammers may take advantage of COVID-19 outbreak fears by selling bogus "treatments" and "prevention" products, establishing fake charities, and sending seemingly legitimate emails with malicious links or attachments.



BEWARE OF FALSE CLAIMS

Do not be tempted by claims and advice on social media or websites that a product or treatment can cure or prevent COVID-19.

Currently, there are no prescription or over-the-counter pills, vaccines, oils, lotions, or other products available to treat or cure COVID-19. Always check with your health care provider before buying such products.

BE CAREFUL WHEN MAKING DONATIONS

Before making donations to support those who are ill or suffering financially because of the COVID-19 outbreak,
DO YOUR HOMEWORK:

- If the appeal claims to be from a charity, make sure that it is registered with the Attorney General's Charitable Trusts Unit. The list may be found here: www.doj.nh.gov/charitable-trusts/
- If the appeal is for an individual, think hard about donating unless you know the person needing help and that person's circumstances;
- Do not let anyone rush you into making a donation;
- Check that you are dealing with a legitimate charity or individual and not an "impostor" with a deceptively similar name;
- Do not assume that social media recommendations for donations are legitimate.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR PHONY CDC EMAILS

Be careful about opening emails claiming to be from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or from others claiming to have information about COVID-19. Clicking on links or attachments could cause a computer virus to infect your device.
